



Emergency Resolution: DEMOCRATIC FUTURE OF HONG KONG

RECOGNISING the intensive and courageous struggle of the people of Hong Kong for the past five months in protest against the Extradition Bill and Police brutalities, demonstrating their determination to defend freedom and fight for true democracy;

CONDEMNS the Hong Kong Government for unleashing every escalating police brutality against protesters, journalists, first aiders, social workers and bystanders including having shot 6,000 rounds of tear gas, shooting with bullets causing permanent injuries and arrests of more 2,400 people, of them one third are students;

CONDEMNS the Hong Kong Government for invoking the Emergency Regulation enabling it to implement the Anti Mask Law with immediate effect on 5 October 2019 without any scrutiny by the Legislative Council, which set a very bad precedent for Hong Kong in using the outdated Emergency Regulation;

CONDEMNS the Hong Kong Government for disqualifying the candidacy of Mr Joshua Wong in the upcoming District Board election for his political stand;

SUPPORTS the demand of the protest movement for the setting up of Independent Committee of Enquiry to investigate into police violence;

CALLS UPON the Chinese Government to honour its pledge under the Hong Kong Basic Law and restart Constitutional Reforms in Hong Kong so that there will be a fair political system to address internal conflicts within the society through a democratic system; and

SUPPORTS the demands of the Hong Kong Confederation of Trade Unions and their allies in the democracy movement for the implementation of universal suffrage in both the Hong Kong Chief Executive and the Legislative Council elections.
